I am writing to you because you may own a property that is adjacent to, within 500 feet of, or may be otherwise affected by activities conducted at the parcel of land commonly known as the "Steam & Diesel Plants" at 142 Lower Lyndon Street in Caribou. This is shown on the enclosed map at Map 25 Lot 149-AA.

The City of Caribou is applying for an EPA FY2023 Brownfields Cleanup Grant. The deadline for submission is Tuesday November 22, 2022. The City plans to submit the application on Monday November 21, 2022.

There will be public hearing during the Caribou City Council meeting on Monday November 14, 2022 at 6:00 pm held in the Caribou City Council chambers at 25 High Street in Caribou (the Caribou Municipal Building). The door served by a ramp that is nearest the bank will be unlocked for the meeting. This public hearing is a requirement of the application. We would really appreciate some feedback on this important community project.

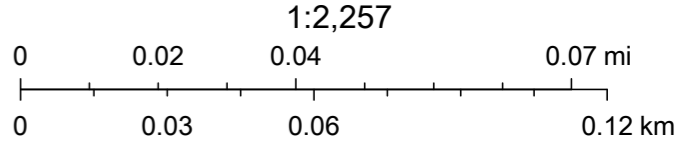


# Maine Geoparcels Map
