# Let's talk about the City of Caribou Brownfields Grant

(To clean up the Riverfront power plants site!)

The City of Caribou has been awarded a \$900,000 grant from the US EPA for the clean-up of the vacant, dilapidated former diesel electric plant and some small buildings down on the Aroostook River near the dam. This site is considered a brownfield because previous industrial uses limit future development. After this project is complete, the City of Caribou will apply for a larger grant to clean up the steam plant. We need your help!

The US EPA contracts with universities to provide technical assistance to brownfield communities (such as Caribou). In New England, the TAB program is administered by the University of Connecticut. The faculty and students have given city staff valuable assistance in the process of obtaining this grant.

Right now, we are working with UCONN TAB to get citizen input. If you have questions about brownfields, please watch the video, "Brownfields 101". It is less than 5 minutes long! Please sign up and take the survey for Caribou.
