There is a church building committee – it is a congregational church so every major thing is decided by the entire church. They have decided to go ahead with the project, for us to take the drawings first into finished schematics with structural and MEP information. We will continue to proceed on the drawings all the way through – we have a full contract – while they decide the contractor and get a GMP.

Joe,

I am so thankful for your work, Unfortunately the City has decided to pursue their own path which is as follows:

They have asked Blane Casey, who came up as lowest bid with acceptable alternates, to spend the next 2 weeks working at getting the prices down to \$9 million. The City has stated that they WILL

NOT spend more than that for building construction. If Blane Casey **cannot** come up with any means by which the costs can be reduced to \$9 million, they are hoping you will be willing to speak with them? They just will not spend more and are willing to look at any means by which they can get a functioning Police Facility for that amount. The 2 week deadline came as a result of the timing for the next City Council meeting where the committee must report their progress. They do not want to give up, but there are apparently no other funds.

I had hoped that you would be in continued consideration, and in a way you are, but they just determined that they would start with the one. I do not know if their method will work or if we can even get a building built. At this point, everyone is in the \$11million range, but it's just not low enough.

On another note, I have a project here in Bangor that wants to go out as Construction Manager. It is about a \$2,000,000 project that includes some demolition and new construction. Can I give them your name as an interested party? We have finished Schematics but I want to get some HVAC and structural ideas down on paper before they interview – so probably the end of July or middle of August.

Again, I cannot tell you how sorry I am that you are not the one they have started with, but I guess that's how it works.
